



# Quayside Sidewalk Sale

## Frequently Asked Questions

**Q: Is there somewhere I can pick up a paper copy of the registration form and return the completed form?**

**A:** If you are unable to download and print the form from the Quayside Community Board website or you are unable to scan and send the completed form, email us at [festival2026@quaysideboard.com](mailto:festival2026@quaysideboard.com). The organizers will try to arrange delivery or pickup of your form.

**Q: What forms of payment will be accepted at the event?**

**A:** This will be up to each seller. The organizers are not processing payments on behalf of the sellers.

**Q: Can a co-op or strata have a single table or group of tables that are shared among the residents?**

**A:** Yes, if some of the residents are willing to organize it. Whoever fills out the registration form will be considered responsible for the spot.

**Q: Why are you prohibiting people from selling food at the event?**

**A:** Food sellers require licenses. The Quayside Community Board cannot assume responsibility for ensuring that the people wishing to sell food have the necessary licenses.

**Q: Why is there a charge for spots that do not contain a table?**

**A:** The Sidewalk Sale is a non-profit event but the Quayside Community Board is not subsidizing the event either. Costs associated with the event include permits, insurance, and administrative expenses. These costs must be covered by those participating in it.

**Q: Aside from tables, will the organizers provide tents, chairs or other items?**

**A:** The Quayside Community Board does not own any tents, chairs, coolers, wagons, carts, or other items that might be useful in this event. We hope to borrow some, but our resources are limited so please do not count on the organizers to provide you with what you need.

**Q: What parking is available near the event?**

**A:** There is very little street parking in the Quayside neighbourhood and most street parking has a 2 Hour time limit. Pay parking is available off Carnarvon Street between 8<sup>th</sup> Street and McInnis. There is also some pay parking next to the River Market. The organizers encourage people to take public transit. The New Westminster Skytrain Station is a short walk from the event.
